

## Dress Code General Guidelines

1. Tops: plain, knit RED, BLACK, and WHITE short or long-sleeved polo shirts are required, with or without postage-stamp-sized logos, and no more than three buttons on the placket. Grades 3-8 must tuck in shirts. Crew neck sweatshirts or sweaters in the same colors as the shirts are permitted (no hood or zipper). Sweaters and sweatshirts may not be worn without a polo underneath. Solid red, black or white undershirts/t-shirts may be worn beneath polo shirts.
2. Bottoms: KHAKI, BLACK, and NAVY BLUE pants or shorts (April 1 - November 1). Bottoms must be worn at the waist. Belts (grades 3-8) must be worn with pants or shorts that have belt loops. Shorts must be at most 2-3 inches above the knee. Athletic, yoga, stretchy leggings/jeggings, warm-ups, sweatpants, cargo pants, and running clothes are not acceptable.
3. Girls may, using the same colors as all other bottoms, wear skirts or skorts at any age. They may wear jumpers in K-5th grades only. Leggings and tights, in the same solid color as all other bottoms, may be worn under skirts, skorts and jumpers. Skirts, skorts and shorts must be at most 2-3 inches above the knee.
4. One RED polo shirt is required for special events, trips or as designated by school faculty and staff.
5. Tennis shoes without heels (“heelies”) may be worn. Socks must be worn with shoes. Dress shoes may be worn as long as tennis shoes are brought in for gym class. For safety purposes, no heels higher than 1” are permitted. Only sandals with backs are permitted; no flip flop type of shoes are permitted. Snow boots may not be worn in the classroom (alternative footwear should be provided for indoors on wintry-weather days.)
6. One set of pierced ears is permitted for girls only. No other piercings are permitted. No ear piercings permitted for boys. Tattoos, including “temporary” or henna tattoos are not permitted.
7. LSUS Phoenix Spirit wear t-shirts and sweatshirts may be worn on Fridays only. Hoods on sweatshirts may not be worn over the head while in the building. Gym shirts are not considered Spirit Wear.
8. Hair must be clean and neat. No artificial coloring or unnaturally colored weaves are permitted, such as but not limited to, blue, purple, pink, green and red. Headbands and bows are permitted. Costume wear is not allowed.
9. Girls in grades 6-8 may wear modest cosmetics. (Please refer to the medical policies in the handbook regarding medicated Chapstick and Carmex.)
10. Girls may wear nail polish. No artificial nails.
11. No hats or head coverings may be worn in the building, unless permission is given by the principal or homeroom teacher.
12. Students will be asked to prove that they have followed the dress code daily.
13. Teachers and staff follow a professional dress code.
14. **Dress Down Days** are designated days announced by the principal or homeroom teacher. This includes a student’s choice to dress down on their birthday. Students must follow the following guidelines on these days:
  - Tops must be short sleeved or longer. Graphics must be God-pleasing.
  - Shorts, skirts, or dresses must be at the most 2-3” above the knee.
  - Pants or jeans may not have rips, tears or holes.
  - Athletic, yoga, stretchy leggings/jeggings, warm-ups, sweatpants, and running clothes are not acceptable.
